Not sure if it's available where you are, but this is much simpler than having to mount switches and run. Core Layer: The core layer is the backbone of the hierarchy network. The primary transmission and routing of data signals take place at the core layer only. When I mean servers, I'm mostly talking about servers used internally (DHCP, RADIUS, RDS, DNS, SNMP, NETFLOW). Engineered to aggregate massive volumes of data from distribution switches, it provides ultra-low latency and maximum throughput to ensure uninterrupted routing and packet.
